This is because of "Black Friday" in the online gambling world (when the US government essentially outlawed online gambling by making it illegal for banks to process these types of "money" transactions)

Since that time there are plenty of people "Jones'n" for their online casino games and poker fix.

The People Have Spoken

Online Gambling - including Poker - Is Back

Whenever there is a huge "need" to be fulfilled the "market" will usually speak – and the market has spoken.

Cryptocurrency To The Rescue

With the advent of Bitcoin and other cryptocurrencies which are not recognized by the "powers that be" (in most countries including the USA) as a genuine currency or "real money" – online casino gaming (including poker) has arisen again and there are several legitimate online sites that we have been playing at with no problems.

How To Start Gambling Online With Crypto Currency

Easiest Way To Get Some Bitcoins

If you aren't familiar with how to acquire Bitcoin in order to play poker or other casino games online there are many ways to get some. It is important to familiarize yourself with how all of this crypto currency stuff works of course.

Can I Stay Anonymous?

If you are savvy enough and do your research you can of course stay "anonymous" – it's not that hard to do – but for the purpose of this short tutorial we'll only tell you how to link up your bank account to an online service that allows you to purchase Bitcoin with Dollars – or other currency.

Buy Some Bitcoin

The following way – described below – will not make you completely anonymous, but will make everything real easy – and it is "legal" – not that any other way would be illegal, but it is important for many people to feel that they are within the confines of "the law" – so here goes.

CoinBase

Go to Coinbase.com and make an account. Make yourself a Username and a Password. Make sure you enter "two step verification" (or whatever they call it) where once you sign in (like any other online account) they send you a "text" or SMS message to your mobile phone with a special code that you have to enter – that way you (and they) know that it is actually you signing in.

Hook Up Your Bank Account

Once you have an account at CoinBase.com you can now buy some Bitcoin with money from your bank account – but there's a small catch. They are going to want you to verify your bank account with them. It is just like Paypal and other online banking accounts you may have set up in the past.

They will make two small "deposits" to your local bank account that you listed with them and then you will have to check and see how much/what those deposits were and then log back in to Coinbase and enter it into the proper forms.

It is going to take at least a couple of days for all of this to happen.

Once You're Verified

Once you have your account verified at Coinbase.com you can now make a Bitcoin purchase – but it is still going to take some time to get your "coins" – 5 days in our experience.

You can also hook up a credit card with them to buy Bitcoin – verify it, etc., but the initial process will still take nearly a week. So be patient. Once you have all this set up you are good to go.

Faster Way To Get Bitcoin

It is possible to buy cryptocurrencies from other places too – such as Ebay, and other sites. (see below) Ebay recently started a cryptocurrency category so it seems they have loosened their strict policies that made it difficult to do so.

Now You Have Some Bitcoins (or a portion thereof)

Now that you have some Bitcoin in your Coinbase account you can now transfer them to another wallet online – in this case you will want to transfer some to your "wallet" at your favorite online gambling site.

Once again – the transfer is not always "instant" (depending what site you are transferring to) but it is pretty fast – usually ten minutes or so.

What If I Have A Different Kind Of Crypto Other Than Bitcoin?

How can I play at these "Bitcoin Only" casinos and poker rooms?

If you already have some sort (most any sort actually) of cryptocurrency, but you don't have any Bitcoin in order to play at these better and more established Bitcoin sites you can exchange the crytpo coins that you have for Bitcoin and go from there.

Here's How To Exchange Your Current Crypto Coins For Bitcoins

You can make an account (anonymous even) at an online Crypto Currency exchange such as **Cryptsy.com** (that's who we use) – transfer in the kind of crypto coins you already have (we started with Dogecoins) and then sell the kind of "crypto" that you have for Bitcoin (or Litecoin) and then transfer your Bitcoins to your online casino or poker room wallet.

You'll be good to go from there. (just make sure the kind of crytpo coins you already have are listed on the exchange that you are using)

Best Places (we've found) To Gamble Online With Bitcoin (and other cryptocurrencies)

Do I Have To "Download" Something?

In prior years it was always necessary to "download" the casino or poker room to your computer - and in some cases the sites listed below require that – but it isn't always necessary anymore.

Technology has progressed to the point that you can oftentimes play on these sites right from your internet browser, but in most cases (in our opinion) you will still have a better experience if you do go ahead and download their files. It's fast, easy, and free.

Seals With Clubs Poker Review

We've been playing poker at Seals With Clubs for a while now and it is just like the online poker days of old.

You can download the poker room onto your computer (or you can play in your internet browser) and have ready access to a poker game at any time – day or night. SwC has 300 – 400 + active players at any given time so there is plenty of action available.

It's Easy

As mentioned above we have been on the site for a month now and there have been no problems. Once you have yourself some Bitcoin you can deposit it into your account at SwC and they will give you "one chip" for every ".001" bitcoin that you deposit.

We started with .05 bitcoin (around \$30 worth when BTC was worth \$600) to check it out (they credited us with 50 chips) and it was off to the races. We soon had over 200 chips after playing a few ring games of No Limit Hold em as well as a couple of Sit n Go tournaments.
